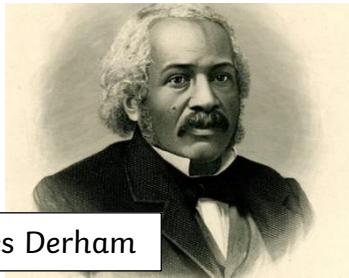

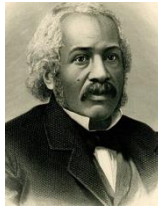


Edith Cavell

1896

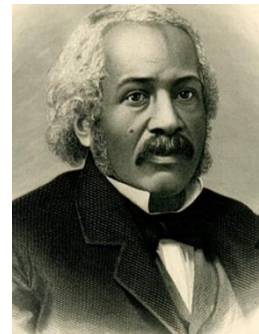
Edith becomes a nurse.



Florence Nightingale looked after soldiers in the Crimean War. She was given the nickname The Lady with the Lamp.



Mary Seacole was also a nurse in the Crimean War. She used her own money to travel from Jamaica to help soldiers on the battlefield.



James Derham was a slave who served doctors in America. The first African American nurse.



Edith Cavell was a nurse in the First World War.
