



Class 1 - Home Learning Challenges

At Landulph School we believe home learning to be an essential and enjoyable part of a child's education. Home learning encompasses a plethora of activities facilitated by those at home which support and enhance children's learning.

From the learning grid below, you also need to choose a **minimum of two activities** to do over the next few weeks of term, but please feel free to do as many as you want.

The children will be given opportunities to share what they have been doing and celebrate their successes with their class. The emphasis will be on the children sharing their work rather than teacher marking. You might want to send in a photograph, they might record it in writing, make something or they might just talk about what they have done.

Self-Managers	Manage Emotions: Can you make a poster showing different emotions? You could write down how you express that emotion. For example: crying when you are sad and laughing when you are happy.	Go for it, Finish it: Can you write your own shape poem? I wonder if anyone could guess what the shape is if we share it in assembly without revealing the shape.
Effective Participators	Persuade Others: What is your favourite season? Can you create a poster, list or give us a good argument as to why the season you like is better than all the others?	Get Involved: If you visit a beach this term, maybe, you could get involved with a beach clean? Send us a picture of you taking care of our beaches, don't forget gloves and a bag. Some beaches like Downderry have litter pickers you can use.
Creative Thinkers	Take Creative Risks: In art this term, we will be making our own sculptures using clay. Can you explore other media that you can sculpt with and make your own sculpture to share? It could be playdough or plasticine or even carving wet sand when on the beach.	
Reflective Learners	Set yourself challenges: Using items found around the house can you create your own boat that floats? Test it and see, is there anything that you need to change to stop a leak or is it falling over in the water?	Share Learning: In English, we are exploring poetry. Can you find a riddle to share with the class? I wonder if they will guess what it's about. Maybe you could create your own riddle?
Enquirers	Explore a question: What do you love about Summer? Draw pictures, write about or make a collage of things you like to do during the summer. We can't wait to hear about it.	Reach conclusions: Which beaches near you can you go to that have lifeguards? Could you visit one and talk to the lifeguards about being safe on the beach? Maybe you could share some of your RNLI knowledge with them.
Team Worker	Build Team Strengths: Using a beach ball or a balloon – can you work in a team and see how long (or for how many taps) you can keep it in the air and stop it touching the floor.
