



## Class 1 - Home Learning Challenges

At Landulph School we believe home learning to be an essential and enjoyable part of a child's education. Home learning encompasses a plethora of activities facilitated by those at home which support and enhance children's learning.

From the learning grid below, you also need to choose a **minimum of two activities** to do over the next few weeks of term, but please feel free to do as many as you want.

The children will be given opportunities to share what they have been doing and celebrate their successes with their class. The emphasis will be on the children sharing their work rather than teacher marking. You might want to send in a photograph, they might record it in writing, make something or they might just talk about what they have done.

Self-Managers	<b>Manage Emotions:</b> Can you tell me about something that makes you happy? You could draw a picture of a toy; you could make a video showing and telling me what it is or doing something and send it in. Photos are welcome too.	<b>Go for it, Finish it:</b> Can you complete a puzzle all by yourself? How many pieces does it have? What skills did you use to help you complete it?
Effective Participators	<b>Persuade Others:</b> What is your favourite thing to make at home? You could bake or make something and try to persuade the class that yours is by far the yummiest!	<b>Get Involved:</b> What can you do to help at home? Find out if there is something you could do regularly. We can't wait to hear about how helpful you are!
Creative Thinkers	<b>Take Creative Risks:</b> Can you find something in nature, it could be in your garden or out and about and draw a picture of it. Focus on the details you can see.	
Reflective Learners	<b>Set yourself challenges:</b> This term could you focus on something you have been trying to do, but not quite got yet? See if you can achieve it – like riding a two wheeled bike or tying shoelaces. Find something that is tricky for you and go for it, achieve it, I believe in you!	<b>Share Learning:</b> As we learn all about where we live this term. Could you teach someone at home how to find where we live by looking at a map of the world and the UK? Can you show them Cornwall and even Landulph?
Enquirers	<b>Explore a question:</b> What do you know about where you live? Can you find out an interesting fact, or a historic story about where you live? Why is it called what it is?	<b>Reach conclusions:</b> Can you find a selection of objects around your home and test whether they float or sink? Predict what you think before you drop it in the water. Are you correct? Does it float or sink? Share your findings.
Team Worker	<b>Build Team Strengths:</b> Can you work together to follow a route on a map? You could plan a walk and then use the map to work out how to complete your journey. We would love to see some photographs of your adventure.	

It is really important that alongside this, your child continues to read daily, practise phonics and number activities / numbots (Y1). We appreciate your support with homework, it makes a huge difference to your child. If you have any questions please come and see us or Mrs Ball.
