



### Class 2 - Home Learning Challenges

At Landulph School we believe home learning to be an essential and enjoyable part of a child's education. Home learning encompasses a plethora of activities facilitated by those at home which support and enhance children's learning.

From the learning grid below, you need to choose a **minimum of two activities** to do over the half term, but please feel free to do as many as you want.

The children will be given opportunities to share what they have been doing and celebrate their successes with their class. The emphasis will be on the children sharing their work rather than teacher marking. You might want to send in a photograph, they might record it in writing, make something or they might just talk about what they have done.

Self-Managers	<b>Be organised</b> Organise a fitness/circuit activity for your friends or family.	<b>Manage Risk</b> Go for a healthy walk or bike ride. Show us pictures of where you go!
Effective Participators	<b>Make Links</b> Find an online exercise video to join in with Joe Wicks 8 min workouts is a good choice! Get the family to join in!	<b>Identify Issues</b> Create a leaflet explaining the importance of healthy bodies.
Creative Thinkers	<b>Take Creative risks</b> Create a healthy meal. Ask a grown up to help you make a balanced meal.	<b>Imagine</b> Imagine you are a health professional, can you pretend to give someone a health check up and make recommendations to them?
Reflective Learners	<b>Set yourself challenges</b> Using our shape learning in maths, use junk modelling to make a creation, anything you like!	<b>Share learning</b> Use computing software to create a shape picture.
Enquirers	<b>Evaluate evidence</b> Keep a food diary for a week. Could you make changes to make it healthier?	<b>Reach conclusions</b> Find out information about a European country and compare it with the UK.
Team Worker	<b>Manage the team</b> Can you work in a team to construct something from lego, duplo, k'nex etc?	<b>Take responsibility</b> In English we are reading Journey by Aaron Becker. Plan a route near where you live and take a grown up on a journey.

In order to embed core English and Maths skills, we ask that children read at home daily, learn phonics/spellings and access our bought subscriptions: Time Tables Rockstars, Numbots and Spelling Shed.
