We have had a fantastic first week in Class 2. All of the children have come in with a sensational approach to their learning. Mrs Plumb, Mrs Slateford, Mrs Grainger and I are so excited for the year ahead. In just 4 days, we have already made fabulous progress in our times table recall. We had a wonderful music lesson with Mrs Butlin, learning musical terms like staccato and allegro. The older pupils have been brilliant role models to the newer pupils in the class.



Class 3



This week has been a very full on, exciting and educational week for both the class and myself! It has been fantastic to meet this amazing group of children and begin to get to know their likes, dislikes, talents and challenges and I have no doubt that we will begin to forge a formidable team in not too long. To start us off, the children have been introduced to our half-term Topic – 'Where Do You Want To Go?' which has allowed us to take a global view of ourselves and begin to consider places around the world that we have visited and those to which we hope to travel.



We have begun reading Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo and have used this as a basis to write a balanced argument and consider some of the positive and negative aspects of world travel. Our maths journey has commenced with an in-depth look at our number system and trying to unpick the fundamental foundations of what enables us to represent an infinite amount of values using only 10 digit symbols.



We have engaged with many team activities in PE, PSHE and RE and focussed on the attributes that allow a team to function well and to maintain positive outlooks. Finally, in science we have been exploring the properties of various materials (Year 5) and identifying the major discoveries in electricity (Year 6). It has been busy but incredibly enjoyable and rewarding. Roll on next week!


