#### Celebrating our learning...

#### Class 1

Class 1 have had another busy week. We all enjoyed a very active PE lesson, where we have been learning ball skills such as hand to eye coordination, kicking and throwing. We loved using the ukuleles in our music lesson with Mrs Butlin!

In Wild Tribe we have continued our learning of the story of the Three Little Pigs by creating Big Bad Wolf claws! We drew around our hands, cut them out ourselves and then decorated them with nature treasures.









#### Class 2

Class 2 have been impressing anyone lucky enough to be part of our maths lessons this week. We have all had a place value focus and the pupils' understanding and flexibility of thought has been a joy. As we continue to hone our map skills, we have been completing sketch maps of the school grounds and using digimapping to look for features within our local area. Year 2 have been demonstrating superb knowledge about materials to Mrs Slateford in Science. Year 3 blew away Mrs Plumb with their sensational rock knowledge and Year 4 made Miss Spence's brain hurt with their thirst for understanding anything and everything to do with states of matter... are fire and clouds solids, liquids or gases?









#### Class 3

This week Class 3 have been writing suspenseful passages with a focus on building the tension and developing a creepy atmosphere. In Maths we have come to the end of our Place Value and Number unit by exploring Roman numerals and negative numbers. In science, both years have ben conducting electricity experiments – Year 5 have been investigating as to which materials are electrical insulators and which are conductors, and Year 6 have been investigating how volts affect components in a circuit. In PE the children have shown how skilful and athletic they can be in invasion games and in PSHE we have been discussing the best ways in which to communicate to avoid upsetting others.


