Celebrating our learning...

Class 1

Year 1 have been working very hard re-writing the story of the 3 little pigs. They produced some lovely neatly presented writing. The children accessed support systems such as red word lists and sound cards to help!

Class 1 also enjoyed their Autumn Scavenger hunt, exploring the school field trying to find items on their list.

We found a birds nest, spider web and acorns!











Class 2

Class 2's week has been jam packed as usual! Our topic centred around the River Tamar came to life - literally, as we examined water sample from the Tamar itself, searching for, and then identifying, invertebrates such as nymphs and the caseless caddis. Our story innovations were completed this week, we move on to informative, non fiction writing next week. In Geography, we marked key cities on a map of the UK, including Plymouth, Exeter and Bristol. Keep an eye out for information being sent today about a trip that we have booked to visit the Tamar Bridge just before half term.







Class 3

In their class book, Kensuke's Kingdom, Michael gets washed up on an island. This week we have been putting our creativity to the test and writing our own versions, making sure we build suspense. In computing we have been using Scratch to make a game with our partners. We have also created a mosaic for the Landulph Festival Art Exhibition.

Next Thursday, 5th October, is National Poetry Day. A day to come together in celebration of spoken word and performance. 500 Words, the UK's most successful children's writing competition has now opened for submissions and will run till Friday 10th November.

This year, the two age categories will be 5-7 year-olds and 8-11 yearolds. Children of all abilities are encouraged to use their creativity and imagination to write a story they would love to read without the pressure of having to worry about spelling, punctuation and grammar.

They want children to have fun writing their stories, be as creative as they can and make us laugh, cry or just be blown away by what we are reading. Over the years there have been incredible stories submitted. There are very few rules on 500 Words but a few points to remember:

All the stories must:

Be 500 words or less (title is not included in the number)

Be written by an individual and not a group

Be a child's own original idea

Be prose, not rap or poem


