## Celebrating our learning...

### Class 1

Class 1 have been busy this week! We started off with early morning work where we discussed what we can see, hear, feel and smell. In Geography, we have been drawing and labelling maps of our local area, and producing some great artwork. We also had a very interactive Science experiment where we tested out which materials kept us dry so we could design an umbrella for our teddy.









## Class 2

Early this week, Class 2 began building the bridges that they have been carefully designing in DT over the last few weeks. Their structure will be tested to hold a tin of beans next week! We were very fortunate to have another visitor this week, sharing their expertise in the Sciences. Mr Wiltshire helped Lower Key Stage 2 to recognise the 3 different types of rock and how they are formed. He kindly brought in lots of hands on resources, including rocks that were up to 400 million years old!! Excitingly, we also got to watch an explosion in one of the quarries that he works with, inspiring a range of questions about explosives. Our writing has meandered into factual river writing this week. We are producing information texts about the River Tamar. For National Poetry Day, we wrote an acrostic poem for the Tamar which helped us to consider all of the things the River Tamar brings to our lives. This year, the two age categories will be 5-7 year-olds and 8-11 yearolds. Children of all abilities are encouraged to use their creativity and imagination to write a story they would love to read without the pressure of having to worry about spelling, punctuation and grammar.

They want children to have fun writing their stories, be as creative as they can and make us laugh, cry or just be blown away by what we are reading. Over the years there have been incredible stories submitted. There are very few rules on 500 Words but a few points to remember:

All the stories must:

Be 500 words or less (title is not included in the number)

Be written by an individual and not a group

Be a child's own original idea

Be prose, not rap or poem
