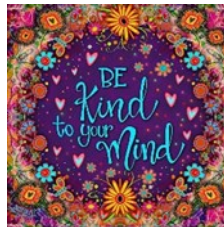

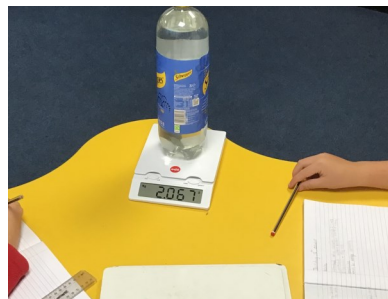
Class 1

We had a fabulous phonics session with the Pixies using our sounds to write CVC words! In Wild Tribe, we were getting in the mood for Halloween, creating nature-inspired sensory pumpkins. In Science, we have been learning about the materials of things around us and classifying them into things that are metal, glass, wood and plastic. The children were fantastic at knowing what things are made from! In PE, the children continued to practice their ball skills.

Class 2 have written some fantastic, informative texts about The River Tamar this week. They are all able to share some really interesting facts about our local river. We are so excited to go on our first trip of the year, on Monday. We all had practical Science lessons this week; Year 2 investigated which materials' shapes could be changed, Year 3 investigated fossils and matched fossil patterns to dinosaurs and Year 4 investigated whether gas had a weight by weighing a bottle of lemonade before and after letting all of the fizz escape!

Class 3 have been working very hard again this week – they have been researching and producing an amazing geography project on a location of their choice, writing travel guides, and producing maps and graphs. They have also been practicing their multiplication and division methods in Maths. Class 3 are becoming adept basketball players and engaged in a mini-tournament across the class. 500 Words, the UK's most successful children's writing competition has now opened for submissions and will run till Friday 10th November.

This year, the two age categories will be **5-7 year-olds** and **8-11 year-olds**. Children of all abilities are encouraged to use their creativity and imagination to **write a story they would love to read** without the pressure of having to worry about spelling, punctuation and grammar.

They want children to have fun writing their stories, be as creative as they can and make us laugh, cry or just be blown away by what we are reading. Over the years there have been incredible stories submitted. There are very few rules on 500 Words but a few points to remember:

All the stories **must**:

Be 500 words or less (title is not included in the number)

Be written by an individual and not a group

Be a child's own original idea

Be prose, not rap or poem

Liz runs a tuck shop every Tuesday breaktime. It is £1 for a drink and a snack; your child will need to bring the money in with them on the day.



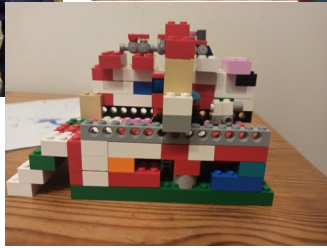
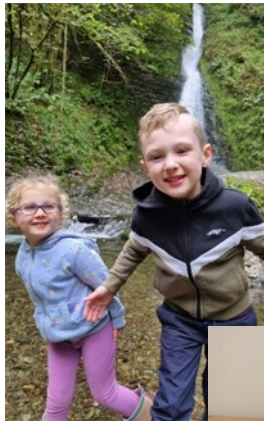
Wellies & Waterproofs

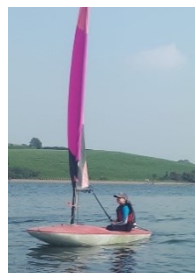
