




Celebrating our learning...


Class 1

Our focus this week has been on learning our number bonds to 10. "Who loves who?" For example, 1 loves 9, 2 loves 8. The children showed some great understanding. For design technology, Class 1 have been designing our own magical landscapes using a grid. We've added castles, carriages, roads, forests and villages.









Class 2

We have had such a wonderful half term in Class 2. It has been lovely to learn more about our local environment and The River Tamar with it being right on our doorstep! We have been so fortunate to have some wonderful expert visitors and speakers to learn from including Anna and Helen from the Westcountry Rivers Trust, Mr Wiltshire sharing his expertise on rocks and quarry explosions, Mark from the Tamar Bridge visitor centre and Mrs Butlin teaching us music. Class 3

This week we have finished our geography projects, written some fantastic travel guides and tackled short and long division. We have also enjoyed using Kahoot to test our science knowledge and conducted some experiments to see how we could separate solutions. In PE we had a basketball tournament which was fiercely (but fairly) fought for and we have completed our seascape artworks that incorporate a range of styles.

This year, the two age categories will be 5-7 year-olds and 8-11 year-olds. Children of all abilities are encouraged to use their creativity and imagination to write a story they would love to read without the pressure of having to worry about spelling, punctuation and grammar.

They want children to have fun writing their stories, be as creative as they can and make us laugh, cry or just be blown away by what we are reading. Over the years there have been incredible stories submitted. There are very few rules on 500 Words but a few points to remember:

All the stories must:

Be 500 words or less (title is not included in the number)

Be written by an individual and not a group Be a child's own original idea

Be prose, not rap or poem




