Celebrating our learning...

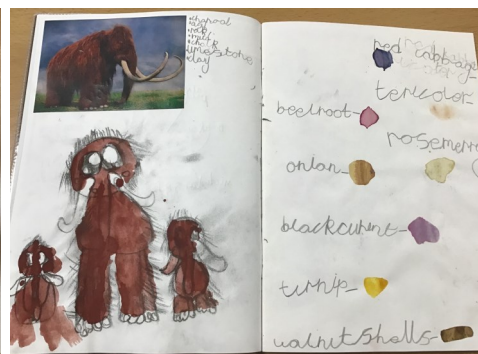
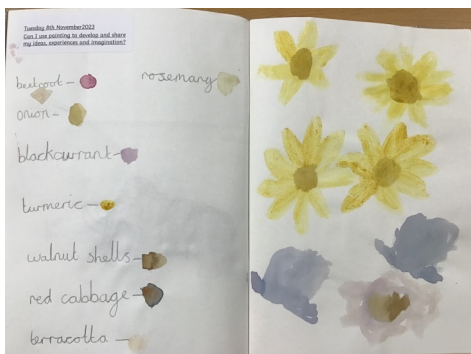
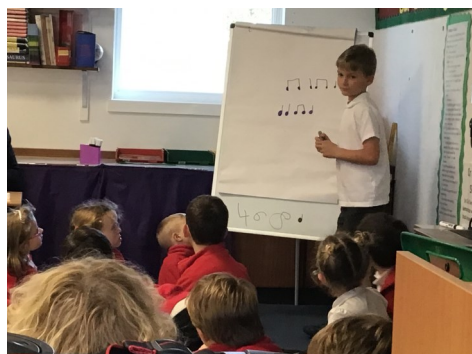
Class 1

In Art, Class 1 have been looking at Bridget Riley, studying how she creates her art and her preference for optical illusions. We looked at pictures that used only three colours and then chose our own three colours to create drawings inspired by Bridget Riley.



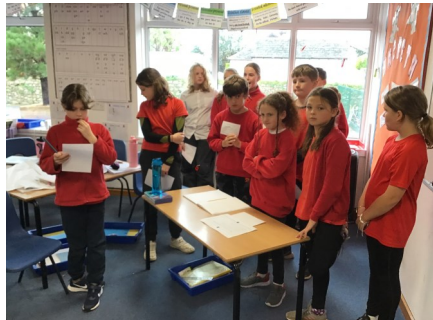
Class 2

This week, Class 2 have been delving further into The Stone Age. We have become really familiar with 'Stone Age Boy' and have tried to step into his shoes and consider the events in 'the first person'. Next week, we will be writing diary entries as the main characters. We investigated the effects of making paints from natural resources such as onion skin, turmeric, walnut shells and red cabbage (that one was particularly fragrant!). Our skills as historians are improving all the time as we consider how we learn about the past and what evidence provides the most data. We have finished the week full of musicality, learning to sing about body parts in French and learning musical notation with Mrs Butlin.



Class 3

This week Class 3 have continued their exploration of Macbeth and engaged in a very heated courtroom debate over who was guilty of the murder of King Duncan. They have followed this up by writing newspaper reports full of quotes and explanations of the events. In Maths we have started to add and subtract a variety of fractions and held an arithmetic workshop. In Science the Year 5 children learned about the planets in our solar system and the year 6 children learned about reflected light. We have continued to explore the diversity of Britain in PSHE and understand equality. We have been improving our handling skills in rugby and solving traversal problems in OAA.





Next week is Anti-bullying week which is co-ordinated by the Anti-Bullying Alliance, based at the National Children's Bureau.

This year's theme for Anti Bullying Week is 'Make A Noise About Bullying'. They want to spread a positive message that if we all come together, celebrate our difference, and stick up for each other,

we can bring an end to bullying! That's why we need your help to make a noise and spread that message this Odd Socks Day.

Across the week we will be exploring how we can reach out to prevent and stop bullying and celebrate what makes us all unique.

So, to launch Anti-Bullying week we will be joining with other schools and workplaces across the country and asking children to come into school on Monday wearing 'ODD SOCKS.'

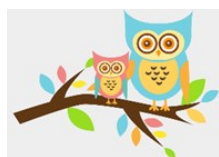
Keep up those good habits...

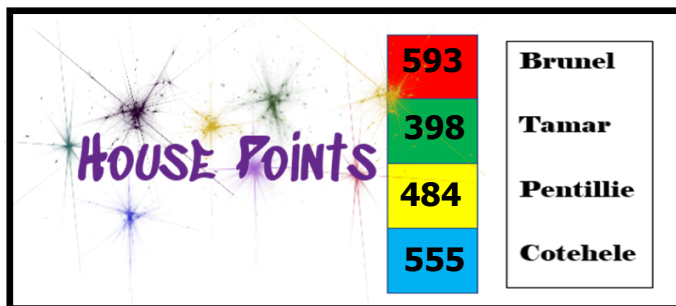

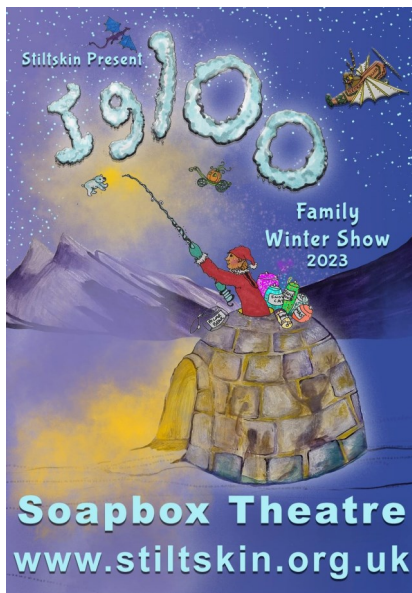
