



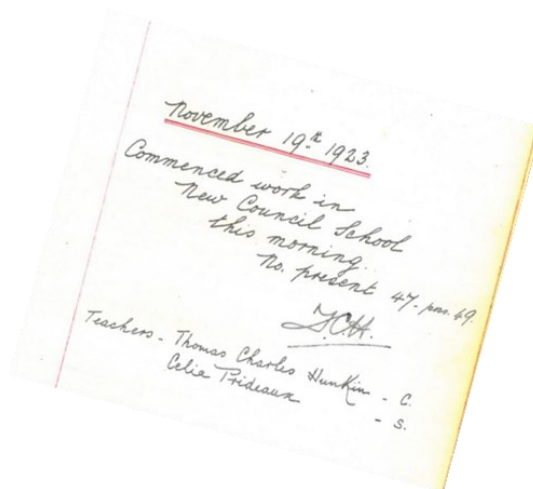

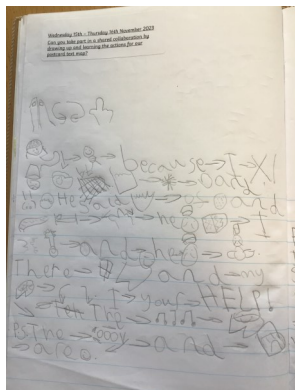

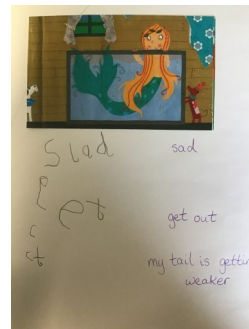


Celebrating our learning...

Class 1



Class One had a great P.E. session this week, it was super to get outside and take advantage of the break in the weather. Class one are really enjoying learning how to play hockey, they are becoming great team mates by working in pairs and small groups. They are building up new skills in control and accuracy. Class One enjoyed some fresh air during our Science lesson this week, we went on an Autumnal walk to identify signs of Autumn. Pupils had to work in pairs and identify signs of Autumn on a tick chart, we saw so many wonderful sights; lots of fallen leaves on the ground, pine cones, mushrooms and the children were thrilled to spot three pheasants in the field too! In English Year 1 have been writing a story text based on a postcard that the singing mermaid sent them. Foundation have been describing how the singing mermaid was feeling.



Class 2

We've managed to fit in some super learning this week around all of the exciting extra events that have been happening. With it being 'Inter-faith Week', we discussed a range of religions during RE and one 'golden thread' that ran between them all, the idea of treating others in the way you wish to be treated. We discussed this theme again recognising anti-bullying week. As a class, we made a very loud noise to 'Say No to Bullying'. We have finished the week talking about the purpose of Children in Need.



Class 3

This week class 3 have performed Macbeth to an audience. There were star turns on the stage and the full drama of 'The Scottish Play' was retold expertly! We have continued to work with fractions – this time becoming masters at adding and subtracting them. In PE we have improved our tag rugby attacking skills and played Capture the Flag in OAA. We have also continued to have active bursts throughout the day by completing Just Dance activities or Ninja dodge videos. In DT we have begun to plan and storyboard what our pop-up books will look like. As this week is Anti-Bullying week, we have held many discussions on the subject and tried to agree on some strategies to help ourselves and our friends out of such situations.

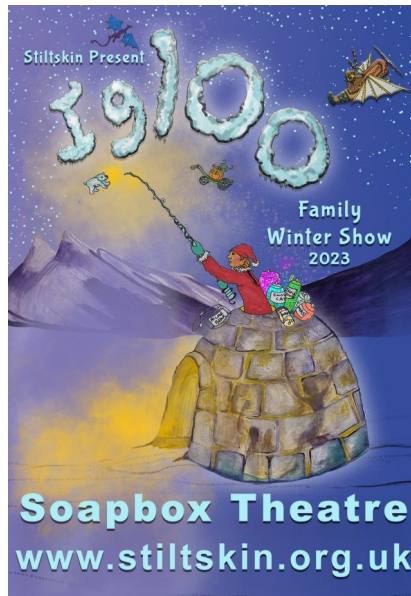
