Thank you for your prompt responses to ticket requests for the show. Cathy is busy allocating seating and will be in touch if we are able to release any additional tickets.


The performance is expected to run for approximately an hour.


Thank you for those that have sent in costumes already, please can we have any outstanding ones by **Monday 4th December** as we are having a dress rehearsal.


If you are coming to a performance, please be considerate of our neighbours...



Celebrating our learning...

Class 1

The Pixies have continued their shape hunting! This week they have been learning about squares and rectangles, and found lots of objects to match the shapes they were searching for. Class 1 have also been listening to classical music and using it as inspiration to draw and paint how the music sounds. They have produced some fantastic artwork!









Class 2

Class 2's knowledge of life in The Stone Age has continued to build this week. We looked at the different types of shelter that may have been used across the 3 periods within The Stone Age. (Ask your child what they were, I'm confident that their knowledge will blow you away!) In Maths, we have been self-assessing our understanding of addition when exchange is required. Sometimes we need to use physical objects to 'see' the method, sometimes we need to draw it pictorially. Some of us are confident using the 'abstract' form, using column addition successfully. Our literacy focus this week has been poetry. We all enjoyed Michael Rosen's poem, 'I was born in the Stone Age'. However, we recognise how inaccurate it is in supporting our historical knowledge! Science finished off our week, where Year 2 investigated changes in materials, Year 3 used mirrors to understand reflection of light and Year 4 made their very own string telephones to deepen their understanding of how sound travels.









Class 3

This week Class 3 have begun a new writing topic (biographies) and to prepare for our final unit piece, which will be a biography of William Shakespeare, we have begun by looking at the life and works of another famous pensmith, Charles Dickens. In maths we have been conducting investigations linked to finding fractions of amounts and we have learned how to multiply fractions. In PE we are becoming really good Tag-rugby players as the running, timing of the pass and defensive strategies are coming together well. We also did some orienteering around the school (which the children loved and ran their hearts out!) and combined this with the codecracking we had learned in computing.
