A message from Mrs Ball...

The spring term is off to a great start and the children have begun exploring their topic for the term ahead. Thank you to all of you who were able to attend the 'meet the teacher' event on Wednesday, we hope it gave you an insight into what your child will be learning and how you can support them.

Class 1 – Where did the dinosaurs go?

Class 2 – Where in the world is Europe?

Class 3 – What are we?

Topic overviews, knowledge organisers and home learning grids will be appearing in your 'inbox' today and will also be available on our school website.

A <u>knowledge organiser</u> is a set of key facts or information that your child needs to know and be able to recall in order to 'master' a unit of work or topic. At home you can use them to support your child by:

- \Rightarrow Reading through the Knowledge Organiser with your child get them to explain it to you 'teaching' you helps them to reinforce their learning.
- \Rightarrow Test them regularly on their understanding of the key vocabulary.
- \Rightarrow Read sections out to them, missing out key words or phrases that they have to fill in. Miss out more and more until they are word perfect.
- \Rightarrow Quizzing
- \Rightarrow Get your child to make a blank Knowledge Organiser and fill in all the gaps without looking.

<u>P.E. Days</u>

On PE days your child needs to come to school in their PE kit. Remember if it is a bit on the chilly side, they can wear black tracksuit bottoms and their school jumper.



Celebrating our learning....

<u>Class 1</u>

Class 1 have had a great start to the first full week of 2024! The Pixies have been learning about 6, 7 and 8 in Maths, focussing on forming the numbers and finding the same amount in objects. In English, the whole class are learning about adjectives. The children took advantage of the dry (although cold!) weather to get outside and learn about the five senses. They then used what they had learned to build a word bank of adjectives to describe their senses.



<u>Class 2</u>

It's been lovely to have our first full week back this week. With a short half term ahead, we're packing everything in with gusto! Our literacy has centered around twisted tales so far, with our writing based on #Goldilocks and our reading around Mouldysocks and the Three Bears. I'm very pleased to say that all of our hard work on times tables each week has stood us in really good stead for the work we are now doing in our multiplication and division unit of Maths. The children are flying through the unit because their times table fluency is so strong. We used the atlases in Geography this week to introduce our topic work about Europe. There were excellent examples of peer support as we looked for rivers throughout Europe.



<u>Class 3</u>

This week Class 3 have been getting stuck into their new inspirational read and stimuli for writing: The Hobbit. We are several chapters in and have already begun to start thinking about how we can use the characters and situations to build some suspenseful narratives. In maths, year 6 have been finding out about ratios and their relationship to fractions, whereas year 5s have been practising multiplying fractions. In science our focus is on living things – year 5 have been dissecting and illustrating plants to find out about how flowering plants reproduce and year 6 have been learning about Carl Linnaeus and how his system for the classification of living things changed how many species are now considered. In geography we are exploring the major natural landmarks of the Americas and comparing those in North and South America. Our art lessons have progressed from using shapes to form animals to sketching animals rapidly from moving images and in PE the class have been demonstrating counter balances and tensions in gymnastics.







Keep up those good habits... Learning spellings, number facts and times tables is so important.

Don't forget your child has a log in to TT Rockstars (Y2-Y6), Numbots (Y1) and Spelling Shed (Y2-6).
