
A message from Mrs Ball...

Attendance is one of the key drivers nationally in education currently and I want to start my message by thanking those of you who bring your child to school every day. Your support for their education is invaluable and the benefits they gain from being at school every day cannot be underestimated.

It is really important that across the school community we promote the importance of school attendance and that we continue to work together to do all we can to prioritise the children's attendance at school.

Good attendance is important because:

- \Rightarrow regular attenders make better progress, both socially and academically
- ⇒ regular attenders find school routines, school work and friendships easier to cope with
- ⇒ regular attenders find learning more satisfying
- ⇒ regular attenders are more successful in transferring between primary school, secondary school, and higher education, employment, or training
- \Rightarrow statistics show a direct link between under-achievement and attendance below 95%



Currently 30% of our children are falling below the 95% good attendance category

We will be working with you to keep you updated on your child's attendance by sending out letters at key points to inform you of your child's attendance should it fall into one of the worrying or concerning categories and we will find ways for us to work together to support your child's attendance.

Taking holidays in term time will have a significant impact on a child's learning, as a school we expect parents to help the school by not taking their child out of school during term time. As a Headteacher I am not able to be authorise holiday requests and they will be classed as an unauthorised absence in line with national guidelines and **could potentially incur a penalty notice**. It is vital that your child is in school, regular attendance is important to ensure the best possible learning outcomes for all children, every lesson counts.

If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £60 if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may result in legal action. Absence not authorised by the school may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a Cornwall Council Code of Conduct for Penalty Notices 8 August 2021 Information Classification: CONTROLLED custodial sentence. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court.

Celebrating our learning....


Class 1

Class 1 have loved our tuff tray activity about root vegetables this week, it has supported our DT sessions learning about nutrition and where our food grows.

We have also been doing lots of impressive writing in English based on our story 'The Girl and the Dinosaur', we have been learning to use adjectives and verbs effectively in writing as well as practicing how to spell the

days of the week.









Class 2

Another week has flown by in a blur in Class 2. We learned about some of the key mountain ranges in Europe in our Geography lesson. In Maths, we have continued our multiplication and division unit, covering lots from doubles and halves to 3 digit x 1 digit calculations.

Science for each year group has really engaged everyone this half term. Year 2 are looking at animals and how they are suited to their habitats which has involved some fieldwork looking for habitats around our school grounds. Year 3's Science is focused on skeletons and muscles. This week we are investigating: Can people with longer femurs jump further that people with shorter femurs? Year 4 are looking in detail about the human digestive system and know some spectacular facts!

It was a joy to share so many successes in our whole school celebration assembly today, including lots of home learning. Thank you for all of your involvement with learning beyond the classroom.









Class 3

This week Class 3 have finished writing their suspense narratives based on the Hobbit and there has been some absolutely fantastic work produced! I am really impressed with everyone's work and how they have skilfully weaved a variety of suspense techniques into a coherent plot. In Maths the Year 5s have continued mastering multiplication methods and now feel very confident, whereas the Year 6s have begun to learn about algebraic expressions, equations and substitutions and although they have more to cover, they are getting to grips with the basics. In science we have been creating classification keys and illustrating lifecycles and in Geography the children have been researching and writing reports on a variety of mountains and mountain ranges across the Americas. In Wild Tribe Mrs Lloyd showed the children how to whittle sticks and in PE the children performed a variety of group balances and counter tensions.

Please can you send your child to school each day with NAMED wellies (they can stay in school if you have a


spare pair) and a waterproof jacket.

Have you had a look at your child's knowledge organisers with them?

A <u>knowledge organiser</u> is a set of key facts or information that your child needs to know and be able to recall in order to 'master' a unit of work or topic. At home you can use them to support your child by:

- ⇒ Reading through the Knowledge Organiser with your child get them to explain it to you 'teaching' you helps them to reinforce their learning.
- ⇒ Test them regularly on their understanding of the key vocabulary.
- Read sections out to them, missing out key words or phrases that they have to fill in. Miss out more and more until they are word perfect.
- ⇒ Quizzing
- ⇒ Get your child to make a blank Knowledge Organiser and fill in all the gaps without looking.
