Attendance Matters



Class 1

Wow, what an exciting week we have had in Class 1! Finally our stick insects have hatched after months of waiting, the children have been so intrigued by our new class pets. So far we think we have had at least six hatch out of a possible ten eggs. They eat privet, ivy and bramble and need a spritz of water regularly to keep healthy. We have named them; Twiggy, Sticky, Twiglet, Woody, Bramble and Ivy. Stay tuned for the adventures of the Class 1 stick insects and see how they develop and grow!



Class 2

Class 2's Geography this term has been centred around the physical geographical features across Europe. Each week, we have started our lesson by trying to locate 16 countries within Europe. All of the children have enjoyed the challenge, trying to beat their personal best week on week. We have been looking at the water cycle also, understanding the processes of evaporation and condensation. Our knowledge about this will help us when writing our own explanation texts in our English lessons next week. Our PSHE lessons this half term have all been about digital wellbeing and how to stay safe online and make the right choices in how we communicate with others through online interactions. With Children's Mental Health Week approaching, we ended this week thinking about the importance of being considerate of other people's feelings and using our voices to lift each other rather than to put anyone down.



Class 3

Class 3 have been learning all about animals this week. We have explored a range of animal reports from the book 'Animalium' and broken down some of the key features of how to write an effective report. In science and art we have focussed on the key characteristics of the six basic animal groups (mammal, reptile, bird, amphibian, fish, insect) and drawn illustrations. And in geography we have learned about the rainforests of North and South America and the plants and animals that can be found there. In PE we have taken our balances and counter tensions to the hall apparatus and the children learned how to build dens and light fires in Wild Tribe.

Have you had a look at your child’s knowledge organisers with them?

A **knowledge organiser** is a set of key facts or information that your child needs to know and be able to recall in order to ‘master’ a unit of work or topic. At home you can use them to support your child by:


- ⇒ Reading through the Knowledge Organiser with your child – get them to explain it to you – ‘teaching’ you helps them to reinforce their learning.
- ⇒ Test them regularly on their understanding of the key vocabulary.
- ⇒ Read sections out to them, missing out key words or phrases that they have to fill in. Miss out more and more until they are word perfect.
- ⇒ Quizzing
- ⇒ Get your child to make a blank Knowledge Organiser and fill in all the gaps without
