On Friday 1st February, the Landulph cross-country team (along with their diligent and fantastically supportive parents) made the short trek to the Landrake Moto-X course for their final competitive race of the season. In contrast to previous race days, it was a reasonably mild and dry afternoon. However, it became apparent upon walking the course that difficulties other than the weather might impact this

race: the path looped, climbed, descended and switched-back in a particularly puzzling fashion, making for a very interesting - but occasionally confusing - race. First up was Elowen who charged out of the blocks and held a very solid mid-pack position throughout before finishing with a burst of energy and a satisfied grin. Next, Coen, Isaac and Freddie set off and completed their lap with ease, each achieving their targeted finishing places. The penultimate race, and first to be two laps long, was for the year 5 and 6 girls: Tia, Skyla, Ruby, Isabelle and Harriet. Again, the girls shot away from the start with parental yells of eager support powering every footfall through the increasingly boggy field. At the halfway point, as the runners looped back past the start, the Landulph girls were all cheered with avidity and every flagging runner received a timely boost, illustrated by a surge of pace and a grateful smile. The girls all finished in very respectable positions and enjoyed their duels with nearby runners. The final race was saved for the year 5 and 6 boys. Thomas was Landulph's sole representative and, after a very long wait at the start line, he tore into the course at a ferocious velocity, overtaking many fellow runners who fell in his wake. Setting a rhythmically confident pace, he ate up the twists and turns and devoured the slopes and descents, not once taking a wrong turn (unlike some of his competitors). Thomas, the consummate socialite, acquainted himself with a football buddy halfway around the course and decided to run with him. Together they helped each other though the worst of the terrain and finished, mud-strewn and ruddy-cheeked, in fine positions. Every child acquitted themselves fantastically and exemplified the sporting and competitive values that Landulph are proud to endorse. Well done to all.

# Celebrating our learning....

#### Class 1

Class 1 have had another busy week! In Maths, the Pixies have been using numicons to learn their number bonds to ten. In Geography, the whole of Class 1 have been looking at maps and learning how to use a compass to identify North, South, East and West. In English we have been learning about non-fiction books and texts. We have loved creating our own fact files linking our knowledge of carnivores, herbivores and omnivores from Science to our English learning.











### Class 2

Class 2 have worked so hard this week to round off the half term. For what is a short half term on paper, they have certainly squeezed a lot in! This week, Mrs Plumb, Mrs Grainger and I have been particularly proud of the children who have been organising and leading activities each day to recognise Children's Mental Health Week. Their confidence and ingenuity has been fabulous. We have had mindful colouring, social opportunities, yoga and stories about worries. We have ended our topic by answering our enquiry question... Where in the world is Europe? Pupils were able to share all of their learned knowledge about the physical geography of Europe, including mountain ranges, rivers and climate. Wishing everyone a lovely half term; relax, refocus and come back raring to go on the 20th!







## Class 3

This week, being the last week of the half term, has been typically busy! We have been utilising all of the skills and knowledge we have learned in English, Art and Science to produce an illustrated report on an animal of our choice. We have focussed on the technical vocabulary and cohesive devices that have allowed us to write particularly professional pieces of writing.

In Geography we have been learning about the importance of Rainforests to the world's ecology, climate, industries and health-care and composing persuasive letters to advocate for their survival. Decimal numbers have been a particular focus for us in Maths (and will continue to be so after the half-term break) where we have explored their place value and how to perform simple calculations. Well done to all of the children for their hard work over the past six weeks.

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

Please can you send your child to school each day with NAMED wellies (they can stay in school if you have a


spare pair) and a waterproof jacket.

#### P.E. Days


On PE days your child needs to come to school in their PE kit. Remember if it is a bit on the chilly side, they can wear black tracksuit bottoms and their school jumper.




