Celebrating our learning....

Class 1

Class 1's book for this term is "Supertato"! This week we have created our own Supertato masks and roleplayed the characters from the story. In PE, we have been learning about negotiating space and running in different styles to avoid obstacles. The Pixies have also been looking at people that help us, matching up uniforms and discussing what they want to be as grown ups.



Class 2

Class 2 have returned to the topic, what's growing out in the fields? Our Science for the half term is based on living things, how they grow and what they eat. We have started reading our class book, 'The Last Bear' and we are all really excited to see how the story progresses. In French this week, we learned how to say the names of family members and we even drew our family trees, annotated in French. It was a soggy start to Wild Tribe this week but that didn't stop us having fun. Fingers crossed for some drier weather going forward.



Class 3

This week class 3 have been introduced to their new topic: The Second World War. We have investigated the causes for the war and how Britain became the target of enemy bombers. To help understand the plight of wartime children in the UK, we have begun to read and dissect 'Friend or Foe' by Michael Morpurgo with includes themes of patriotism, loss, hardship and friendship in the context of evacuated children. We have explored the thoughts and emotions the main character would have experienced when forcibly sent away from his family to another part of the country and written diary entries in character. In maths we have explored the relationship between fractions, decimals and percentages as well as how to measure and calculate angles. In DT we have started to investigate air raid shelters with the eventual outcome of building a model shelter, designed to withstand as much impact as possible. And in PE we have engaged in ferociously competitive dodgeball matches, learning the rules and beginning to employ some tactics.

spare pair) and a waterproof jacket. We try to get outside as often as possible even when the weather is not in our favour.


