St Piran's Day

We had a lovely day on Tuesday, celebrating St Piran's Day. Seeing the whole school dressed in the Cornish colours of black and gold was fabulous. We were blown away by the effort that so many pupils went to in redesigning the Cornish flag. The variety of designs produced, whilst sticking to black and gold was a testament to the creativity of our pupils. We listened to Fisherman's Friends singing Cornwall My Home and ended the assembly listening to Trelawney. The pasties Liz cooked for us at lunchtime were absolutely delicious. We discussed St Piran's story, tin mining in Cornwall and the meaning behind each colour within Cornish tartan. There was a real sense of community, celebrating our Cornish heritage. Onan hag oll.



Class 3 Wild Tribe



World Book Day

'Read your way'. That was the message that we wanted to promote this World Book Day. Reading for pleasure is the single biggest indicator of a child's future success. Because of this, we want to ensure that we give pupils every opportunity to find out what kind of books they like to read or listen to. We love to celebrate our differences and part of that is knowing that we won't all like the same types of books. Fantasy, action, fiction, non-fiction, comic books, graphic novels, poetry, picture books - we want our pupils to experience them all and find the thing that enthuses them. Each child will have come home with a book token. These can be used in exchange for a specific World Book Day £1 book. Alternatively, the voucher can be used as £1 off a book outside the range. The Bookshelf and Tea Rooms in Saltash are the nearest participating retailer. Why not pop in to collect your book and have a Cornish cream tea as a belated St Piran's Day celebration?! Asda, Tesco, Sainsburys, The Works, Waterstones and WH Smith all participate in the scheme also. The children looked fantastic in their book themed costumes. Thank you for all the thought and effort that went into creating them.



Celebrating our learning....

Class 1

Class 1 had a great day on Thursday celebrating World Book Day! In the morning they joined the older children in Class 2 and Class 3 to listen to adults reading their favourite stories. They continued the celebration of books in the afternoon by choosing books to read in pairs. They were very excited to hear Mrs Ashley's news and have enjoyed spending the last few days getting to know their new class teacher Mrs Wiltshire.



Class 2

What a week it has been. We started with a demonstration of music from Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra on Monday afternoon, then fit in St Piran's Day and World Book Day! Alongside all of the excitement for our themed days, Class 2 have continued to work hard across the curriculum. Our English work took a side step into non-fiction this week. As we fall further in love with 'The Last Bear', we were motivated to write some factual sentences about polar bears in the wild, writing about their behaviours, diet and biology. Our learning about fractions has continued in Maths. Year 3 and 4 looked at how fractions can be used to measure between 0-1 on scales. Year 2 have secured their understanding of halves, quarters and thirds. Linking to our learning in Science, we searched for living things in Wild Tribe and thought about different ways to classify them. It's a busy half term with all of the extra curriculum enrichment opportunities, we look forward to seeing what next week brings!



Class 3

Class 3 have had an amazing week! They have been utilising their drama skills to work through the moral dilemma posed by 'Friend or Foe' before writing a balanced argument. They have been learning about area and perimeter and solving some problems. In History the children have researched the Blitz and produced some fantastic presentations which they have delivered to the class. And the highlight of the week was our visit to Bodmin Keep. A former military barracks, the building houses a vast collection of war memorabilia, much of it from the second world war. We explored the museum and learned all about the Homefront, Home Guard and air raids through handling of historical artifacts, dressing up in uniforms and performing role plays. The class were also lucky enough to be taught some rope and military drill skills by army veterans who put the children through their paces. Then, on Thursday the children had World Book Day (where all of the children's evacuee costumes were absolutely spot-on) and they took part in a modelling session and were introduced to a wide range of new books.

On PE days your child needs to come to school in their PE kit. Remember if it is a bit on the chilly side, they can wear black tracksuit bottoms and their school jumper.

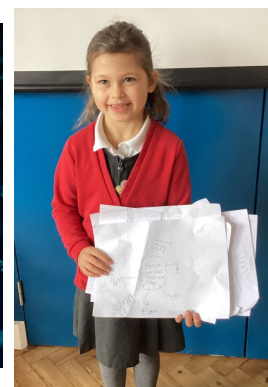
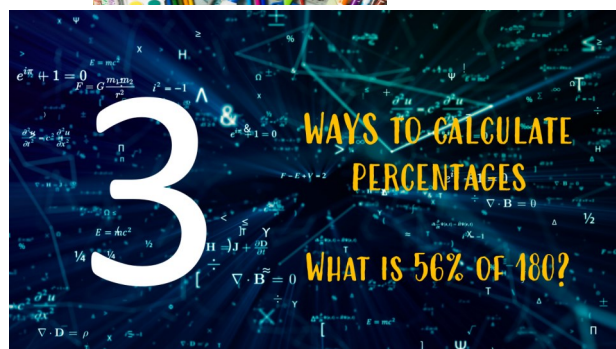
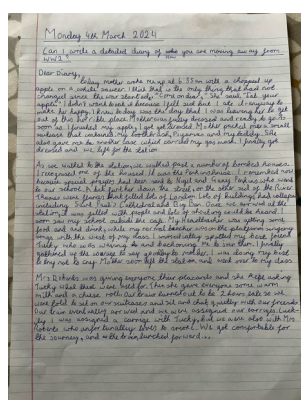
