### A message from Mrs Ball...

This week I want to use my message to focus on the online world. As we continue to strive for a positive and inclusive online environment for our children we want to highlight the importance of promoting kindness online. It's crucial for us to instil in our children the values of empathy, respect, and kindness towards others, even in the digital world. Here are some tips that can help you guide your child in being kind online.



#### Think before you post

Encourage your child to pause and think before they post anything online. Remind them that once something is posted, it can be difficult to take it back. Encourage them to consider how their words or actions may impact others and if it aligns with being kind and respectful.

#### Use positive language

Encourage your child to use positive and uplifting language online. Discourage the use of derogatory or hurtful language, and remind them to always communicate in a respectful and kind manner, even when expressing differing opinions.

#### Respect differences

Teach your child to respect and appreciate the diversity of opinions, cultures, and backgrounds online. Encourage them to engage in constructive discussions and debates without resorting to insults, bullying, or derogatory comments.

#### Stand up against cyberbullying

Educate your child about the harmful effects of cyberbullying and encourage them to be an upstander, not a bystander. Teach them to report any instances of cyberbullying they come across and to offer support to the victim in a kind and compassionate manner.

#### Avoid spreading rumours or gossip

### Governor Day

Yesterday we welcomed our dedicated team of Governors into school for our termly Governor day. They were kept very busy meeting with myself, the staff and of course our amazing children. An extra special welcome to our new parent Governors who have just joined the team - Michelle Blundy and Elaine Potterton.

On Tuesday evening, the school's football team took to the field for their first ever matches. We played on the 4G pitch at Callington College against Stoke Climsland and Calstock. All of the children thoroughly enjoyed their experience and became stronger and more confident as the games progressed. Although the team did not win, there were some excellent skills on display and some fantastically committed defending and goalkeeping.



## Class 1

Class 1 had an enjoyable PE lesson this week where they were able to incorporate some science in celebration of British Science Week. They used the computers to check their heart rates whilst resting. After participating in their PE lesson and doing lots of physical activity, they checked their heart rates again to see the difference.



## Class 2

Another week full of exciting events has come to an end. It has been lovely to dedicate some extra time to Science this week. We have really focused on working as scientists, practising the skills of observation, fair testing, comparing and classifying. One key conclusion from our jelly experiment - don't add pineapple or kiwi if you want your jelly to set! To get an opportunity to bake within the week as well was really fortunate as we could highlight the 'science' involved in cooking that might otherwise go unnoticed. Our writing unit focusing on 'The Last Bear' came to an end this week with some superb descriptive writing and some beautiful sketched illustrations. We will continue to read the story as our class novel daily as we are all excited to find out where April's adventure with Bear will take them both.



## Class 3

The Class 3 children have been engaging in plenty of science this week – we started by looking at how we learn and make neural connections in our brains and that these connections can fade if not regularly revisited and refreshed. We then programmed our Micro Bits to make them thermometers and undertook a survey of temperatures across the playground. Then we explored the density of water and made some sugar water rainbows. We have also nearly finished our reading of Friend or Foe and wrote our own predicted final chapter – there were some very interesting takes on the story! Year 5 also visited Liskeard Fire Station for some very important life skill messages and really enjoyed their morning whilst learning vital information.




