## Class 1

Class 1 have continued their learning on their topic "What makes superheroes super" this week. We have been practising a new poem, "If I was a superhero", by Sally Gray. We would love to hear if the children have been able to recite it at home. Carrying on the theme of people who help us, we had an exciting visitor into class on Thursday - a police officer! The children learnt all about a police officer's duties, explored a police car, had their fingerprints taken and even got to talk to the control centre. Thank you to our visitor for providing the children with such a wonderful experience.


Class 2
Class 2 started a poetry unit this week. We delved into the world of free verse which has been very liberating! Giving the children the freedom to write without specific subject content resulted in an eclectic, fascinating collection of poems. We have been looking at inventions during The Bronze Age and how they changed life at the time and the impact they have had on our lives today. This week, we created posters 'advertising' Bronze age weapons and tools, their main selling point being the durability and strength. In maths, our fractions unit has continued. All of the pizzas being cut into fractions and shared for home learning are making the staff very hungry each time they are sent in! Thank you for the effort that has gone into supporting children apply their knowledge at home this week. On Thursday, during Wild Tribe, the children produced some fantastic representations of minibeasts following our learning about different types of animals and how to classify them.


## Class 3

Class 3 have been diving into poetry this week. We have explored similes and metaphors in the poems 'Don't Be Scared' by Carol Ann Duffy and 'I Wandered Lonely as a Cloud' by William Wordsworth and alliteration and onomatopoeia in the poems 'Betty's Room' by Denise Rogers and 'Let's Give a Cheer for Onomatopoeia' by John Foster. The children have then been creating their own descriptions using figurative language. In maths we have calculated volumes of 3d shapes and a range of angles. We have been considering the changing roles for women during the Second World War and writing diaries based on the accounts we learned of. In science the Year 6s have been learning about how Darwin theorised evolution from his observations of Galapagos finches and the Year 5s have been interrogating data on the growth rates of children.
