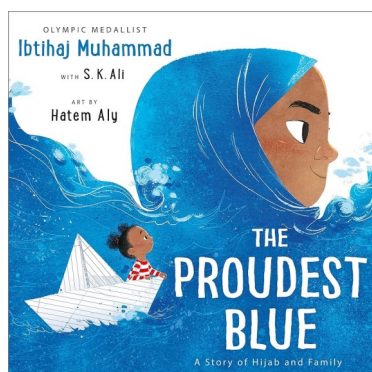
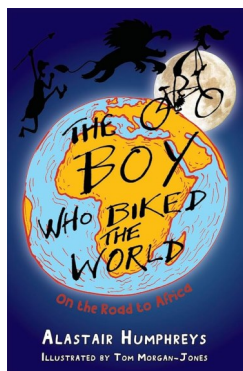
Class 1

Class 1 launched their topic "How are rainforest plants different to ours?" this week with enthusiasm. We were finally able to enjoy some sunshine and hunt for plants on the school field. We have also started learning about continents and ocean names, and began our story map for our new book "There's a tiger in the garden".



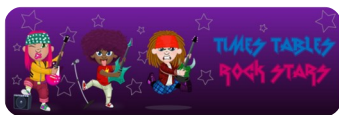
Class 2

This week, we launched our new topic in Class 2. The children found out that we will be learning all about 'The Olympics'. We are asking the question, 'How can we make Team GB proud?' We watched the lighting of the Olympic torch in Olympia and discovered that 4 sports in this year's games are surfing, skateboarding, climbing and break dancing which we were surprised about. We read a book by an Olympian, 'The Proudest Blue' by Ibtihaj Muhammad and we've used 'The Boy who Biked Around the World' to inspire our writing over the next few weeks.



Class 3

In Class 3 we have flown into our new term with gusto! Our new topic is about global commerce and fairtrade and we have contrasted the climates in the UK and in the Ivory Coast, where cocoa beans are grown. We will then explore the journey of these beans as they eventually become chocolate and take into account the various transports, trades and the associated carbon footprint. We have begun to 'read' Shaun Tan's 'The Arrival' and are using this interesting and unusual picture book to develop some narrative and letter writing opportunities. I am really impressed with how the class are interrogating each image and drawing every bit of evidence from them in order to produce their own opinions and interpretations of the story. In maths we are looking at statistics and have been interpreting and drawing line graphs, tables and pie charts. In science and DT we are exploring nutrition and learning about what each key nutrient offers the body and from where different foods are sourced. And in PE we practiced some fielding skills as we work through our cricket unit.
