

Celebrating our learning....

Class 1

Class 1 have been having fun with numbers this week! The Pixies took advantage of (some) dry weather to get outside and use nature for counting. They then wrote the corresponding numbers and checked their work for accuracy. Year 1 have been learning to count to 100 and back again using the interactive whiteboard. We also used the Beebots for coding and programming directions. Class 1 were also excited to have an addition to our growing nature table - some chicken eggs! They have loved learning about the incubation process and have been so careful when looking at them.











Class 2

Class 2 have been around the world this week! We wrote some beautifully descriptive diary entries as if we had visited some of the modern wonders of the world, just like Tom, the main character from our class text. In maths, each year group has had quite a different focus. Year 4 have been introduced to the world of decimals! They enjoyed it so much that many Year 4 pupils requested extra homework to practice dividing by 10! Year 3 have continued to work with fractions and Year 2 have been learning how to measure mass in grams using different types of weighing scales. They were able to apply this learning in DT also, as the whole class made different types of bread, suited to an Olympic athlete's diet.











Class 3

Class 3 have continued to explore 'The Arrival' and have written some descriptive passages based upon the settings illustrated. Statistics, specifically timetables and pie charts, have posed some problems in maths but the children have been able to apply their prior learning to determine solutions. The Year 6 children have also been putting together some revision cards as the countdown to SATs descends below 20 days. In science we have been modelling the circulatory system and learning about the function of the heart. The children have demonstrated some excellent fielding skills in cricket and have been working on their techniques for accurate catching and throwing. In DT the children researched foods from around the world and employed some techniques for preparing a mango!
