Class 1

Hello everyone, Autumn has hit really hard, and the children have loved listening to and watching the rain while playing in the covered area outside. This week we have started our topic and we have been looking at maps and exploring Digimaps to find out where we live and how it looks from above. In maths we have been counting, exploring numbers and matching quantities.

The first spelling test was completed by the year ones, and they were so amazing! We can really tell that they practised. We introduced our story Stanley's Stick, by John Hegley. It's such a fun story and gave us some inspiration when we went to find sticks in the field and talk about what they could be...

What a great first full week we have had and I hope everyone isn't feeling too tired!



Class 2

This week Class 2 have really ploughed into our learning! In English we have been reading and recalling our inspiration text 'Song of the River' by Joy Cowley; next week we will start to plan our own river stories. We have been working hard at partitioning 2 digit numbers (yr 2) and 3 digit numbers (yr 3). We had our first science lessons, with year 2 learning about habitats and year 3 classifying animals. In Vipers lessons we are slowly reading through chapter 1 of Wind in the Willows...it's long so we are taking it in very small chunks! The children have been really inspired by our topic of 'What is the River Tamar used for?' and I'm sure we will have lots of lovely home learning coming in soon enough.



Class 3

Despite the rainy weather this week, Class 3 have not let it dampen their spirits!

In English, pupils wrote a balanced argument debating whether they would sail around the world and created imaginative journal entries about being marooned on a desert island.

In Maths, we explored partitioning and decimal numbers, building confidence with place value. Our Geography lessons focused on how the equator and prime meridian divide the globe, while in Art we experimented with shading techniques to show light, dark, and reflections.

In PE, pupils practised their tennis skills and worked together to solve a range of team challenges. Computing lessons saw us deepen our understanding of coding with Micro:Bits, while in PSHE we explored important aspects of mental health and wellbeing.
