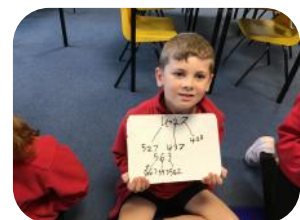
Class 1

Hi everyone, it's already the end of week 3 and what a wonderful and busy week it's been. The children all worked together to create a story map of our class book, Stanley's stick. Can your child retell the story to you using the Makaton signs to go with it? We had session 3 of our decider skills and today Erica shared with us how we can use the 5,4,3,2,1 system to help when we are feeling over-whelmed. During Maths we have continued learning about place value and focused on counting on from any given number as well as 1 more. Finally, our habitats topic in science has had us identifying different animals and thinking about what they eat.



Class 2

This week seems to have really flown by! We have started planning our stories about the journey of a river, ready for writing next week, and the ideas are looking good! In maths we have been representing numbers on number lines and estimating where numbers would fit on number lines to 100 and 1000. Last Friday we had a lovely geography lesson in which we used Digimaps to locate our local area. We found Landulph and Cargreen and really enjoyed following the map to spot places that we know. In particular, we were fascinated to follow the river Tamar from its source (up past Tavistock) all the way down past us and into the sea. Next week we'll be able to show pictures of our trip to the Tamar Bridge education centre!



Class 3

It's been another exciting week of learning in Class 3!

In English, we have been using parenthesis to add extra detail and description, applying this to our writing about a desert island. In Maths, pupils practised rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100, 1000 and decimal places.

Our Geography lessons introduced lines of longitude and latitude, helping us to understand how locations are identified across the globe. In PE, pupils tackled a range of teamwork challenges, showing excellent communication and collaboration.

In RE, we explored the Big Bang and Evolution theories and compared them to the Christian creation story, discussing similarities and differences. Meanwhile, in Science, pupils built and drew electrical circuits, developing both their practical and recording skills.

A special thank you to all the parents who joined us for the Morning of Code – the children thoroughly enjoyed sharing their learning with you.
