Class 1

We were so lucky to have the most beautiful calm and sunshiny weather for our trip around the village on Tuesday. The children were excellent at using the maps they created to identify different features and locations around Landulph and Cargreen. They were exceptional and a credit to the school managing the whole walk with determination. The biscuit treats and play in the park definitely went down well too. During English, the children explored the book called "Maps" and started looking at how we write instructional texts. Don't forget those bossy words. In Maths we have been comparing and sorting numbers and objects. Including identifying how many letters they each have in their names and then sorting them from the fewest to the greatest amount. Finally, we created our art piece for the Landulph Festival, which will be displayed in the memorial hall throughout the month, so don't forget to pop down and have a look.



Class 2

In Class 2 this week, we have started lots of new learning. We have begun our new maths topic of Addition and Subtraction, beginning with a little bit of money, and now on to fact families and number bonds. We have finished our lovely river stories and are now beginning to gather information to write an information text. In our geography learning we are starting to look at the UK and its rivers and mountains. Last Friday was European day of languages, and we had a lovely time singing a French song and practising some of our basic French!



Class 3

This week began with an exciting trip to Liskeard Town Hall for the Trust Arts Day. Pupils took part in a range of creative workshops – we learned about inventions and even travelled in a very real time machine, produced raised relief prints, and choreographed energetic, thematic dance routines. It was a fantastic and inspiring day for everyone.

Back at school, we have been busy too! In English, pupils planned and wrote a new chapter for Kensuke's Kingdom, using their imagination to continue the adventure. In Maths, Year 4 built confidence with subtraction of whole numbers, while Years 5 and 6 developed their skills in subtracting decimals. In Science, we explored the work of the pioneers of electrical science and engineering, learning how their discoveries shaped the modern world. Finally, in Art, pupils created a beautiful piece for the Landulph Festival, showcasing their creativity and talent.
