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Class 1

Autumn has arrived in class 1. The leaves are turning and we're getting all seasonal. We zipped into the field to create our own maps using symbols to show where we can find everything and how to get around. In maths, Year 1 have been looking at fact families and number bonds within ten and the Pixies have been building on their subitizing to 4. We became a bit rude in English and looked at how we use bossy language to write instructions. Mrs Butlin has continued to support us with our music sessions and we have been busy practising for Harvest Festival next week. Next week, watch out for the incoming pumpkins everyone!



Class 2

In class 2 this week we have been building up information for our River Tamar information texts, which are nearly finished and almost ready for publishing. In maths we have started addition and subtraction, and have been focusing on numbers that make 10, 20 and 100. We can now find a complement to 100 from any number up to 100! We have started our new KIRFs this week, and we will be fitting these in as often as we can. We ask that you show your support at home by practising them little and often: Year 2 are working on number bonds to 20 and Year 3 have number bonds within 50. Next week we are looking forward to publishing our information texts and preparing for our harvest festival!



Class 3

The highlight of our week was an exciting visit to Haye Farm, where the children learned all about organic farming and even got hands-on with some leek harvesting! It was a fantastic opportunity to see sustainable farming in action and understand where our food comes from.

Back in the classroom, we've been busy across all subjects. In English, pupils have started exploring the features of travel guides and focused on the different uses of commas in their writing. In Maths, we have been building confidence using formal written methods to multiply multi-digit and decimal numbers.

As part of Black History Month, we have explored song lyrics and poetry written by influential Black artists and poets, discussing their messages and impact.

Keep up those good habits...


Learning spellings, number facts and times tables is so important.
