### KS2 Cross Country at Trethew – Friday 10th October 2025



On Friday 10th October, the Landulph cross-country team travelled to Trethew for the first race of the season. The weather, unusually for cross country, was clear and mild — a welcome change from the traditional drizzle and mud-fest we've come to expect. That said, Trethew's course provided plenty of challenge: a hilly, winding route that disappeared behind distant fields before looping back towards the cheering crowds. The Year 3/4 competitors faced one demanding lap, while the Year 5/6 runners braced themselves for two.



First up was Lucy, representing Landulph in her very first cross-country event. She lined up bravely with the other Year 3/4 girls, ready to take on the challenge — a fantastic show of courage for her debut appearance.

Next came the Year 3/4 boys' race, featuring Huxley and Maxwell. Both boys ran determinedly across the undulating course, tackling each hill and turn with grit and enthusiasm. They each finished strongly and were rightly proud of their performances — a great start to the season for our younger runners.

Then it was time for the Year 5/6 boys' race, where Coen, Isaac H, Isaac F, and Freddie took to the start line. The two-lap course tested their endurance, but all four set off at a steady, powerful pace. Each runner gave their all, conquering the slopes and pushing hard to the finish. All the boys crossed the line knowing they had truly given their best effort.

Throughout the afternoon, the Landulph runners cheered one another on, shouting encouragement from the sidelines and celebrating every finish with smiles and muddy high-fives. It was a wonderful display of teamwork, resilience, and sportsmanship — qualities that make our small school team stand tall among much larger ones.

Well done to everyone who represented Landulph so brilliantly. The team are already looking forward to their next race and the challenges (and hills!) that await.

We combined creativity with technology in Computing and Design by using Micro:bits and servos to design animated, interactive toys and gadgets. Finally, the week will end on a high note with everyone playing an important role in our Harvest Festival at Landulph Church, contributing readings and excellent artwork.

Keep up those good habits...


Learning spellings, number facts and times tables is so important.
