



We have spaces available in other year groups.

If your child was born between 1 September 2021 and 31 August 2022, it is time to apply for a foundation place. The deadline is **15th January 2026**



Class 1

Hello everyone! A jam packed and learning filled week was had by all. We continued to explore our story, this week focusing on details and asking ourselves, what happened to the dragon to make it scared of mice? We then made beautiful dragon eyes with clay looking at and recreating the details around the pupil and painted pictures of dragons eyes using fiery colours. In maths we explored further how two parts make a whole amount and how a whole amount can be shared into parts. In history we looked at different castles and made a timeline, to see how they have changed over the last 1000 years. Everyone was surprised that Windsor castle is not only nearly 1000 years old (a similar age to Trematon and Tintagel) but it is so well maintained, we soon realised, how could the king live anywhere that wasn't perfectly preserved. We also sorted different materials in science and as part of our belonging topic in RE we explored different types of religious and non-religious weddings.



Class 2

Class 2 are now fully immersed in our new learning topics and we are thoroughly enjoying them! We are now well into our story, the Lion and the Unicorn which is a story about a wartime evacuee. We have been looking closely at the features of the story, such as past tense, first person and conjunctions; we will begin to plan our own stories next week. In maths we have now moved on to subtraction, having nailed our addition skills, and as well as some brilliant maths skills we have been working hard on presentation in books which is really paying off! The presentation in all our books is excellent! In history we are continuing to learn about World War II, which is especially topical following on from our Remembrance day assembly this week.



Class 3

In English, the children have continued reading Friend or Foe, while developing their skills by writing descriptive passages and creating scripts for dialogue. In Maths, they have been exploring both short and long division methods, applying these strategies to a range of calculations. History lessons focused on the Dunkirk evacuation and the rapid advance of German forces, giving pupils a deeper understanding of this pivotal moment in World War II. During Science, the class investigated how the eye functions, conducting experiments to observe pupil dilation under different lighting conditions. In Art, pupils produced striking depictions of WW2 aircraft, combining creativity with historical understanding. As this has been anti-bullying week, the children have also investigated situations and consequences of bullying at all levels and have shown what empathetic and caring children they are.


