
Class 1

Well, we think the children have managed to enjoy every type of weather this week! During science we continued to explore materials and the children went around the school finding different materials and sorting them into categories. During history we talked about Launceston Castle and looked at how it has changed over the years. We could not believe the difference! There are so many more houses now compared to 900 years ago. We looked at how symbols can link us to a religious community and explored different types; from visual, to the symbols that we wear. During RE we sequenced the story ready to begin re-writing it and sorted sentences into the correct order, focusing on remembering the very important capital letters and full stops. During maths we moved on to recognising when we need to either add or subtract. We were all a bit disappointed that we didn't get to play in any snow today but hope we may get a chance soon. We hope you have lovely long weekend!



Class 2

This week has absolutely flown by in Class 2! We have completed our maths learning about addition and subtraction and will be starting multiplication and division next week, so please get practicing on TTRS! In English, we have been working on our evacuee stories based on the learning we have done about what life was like for an evacuee, and combined it with our history learning. In science this week, Year 3 and 4 learned about pitch and amplitude by thinking about the length of soundwaves made by a noise. But really, the biggest news is that we are ready to start earnestly rehearsing for our Christmas show! Please encourage your child to practise their lines and be ready from next week! Exciting!



Class 3

Despite the wintry weather, the children have been working brilliantly across all subjects. In English, we finished our Friend or Foe diary entries, with pupils focusing on the emotional turmoil of the characters and using powerful description to bring the dramatic Dartmoor setting to life. In Maths, we have been adding fractions with increasing confidence, using models and diagrams to support our thinking. Our Science lessons have explored light, with children investigating how the angle of incidence affects the angle of reflection through hands-on experiments. In PE, the class enjoyed creative dance games, building teamwork and rhythm. And in History, we continued our work on World War II, learning about the Blitz and beginning to create our own presentations to explain its impact.


