### Class 1

This week in Class 1 we have been looking at the "Pop Art" movement. We have focused on the artist Andy Warhol. We've recreated his famous painting of "Marilyn Monroe" using our own faces. Mrs Truscott and Mrs Ashley were very impressed with the children's fabulous paintings!



### Class 2

The work continues in Class 2 despite all the extra rehearsals and things to do! We have been learning a little bit more about the Battle of Britain and the role played by the RAF in defending the country. In our reading Vipers this week, we have read a couple of Christmas stories, The Tin Soldier and a very shortened version of A Christmas Carol. In our maths learning we have looked at multiplication as being repeated addition, for example  $2 \times 3$  is the same as  $3+3+3$ . This is a tricky concept to master, but very valuable for future maths understanding! We also had a lesson learning how to double numbers, building up to being able to double 2 digit numbers by using either partitioning or pictorially drawing the number then drawing it again. This meant we could spend some time playing doubles games which was good fun!



### Class 3

In English, the children have been exploring the structure and style of sonnets, before having a go at writing their own using figurative language and careful rhythm. In Maths, we have been building confidence in calculating fractions of numbers, using clear steps and plenty of practice to secure understanding. Our History lessons focused on how Britain was affected by World War II in the decades that followed, with the class discussing the long-term social and economic changes that shaped modern Britain. In Science, we investigated the refraction of light and observed how light bends when it travels through different materials. Alongside all of this, we've had lots of Christmas concert rehearsals, and the children are doing brilliantly as the big performances draw closer!




