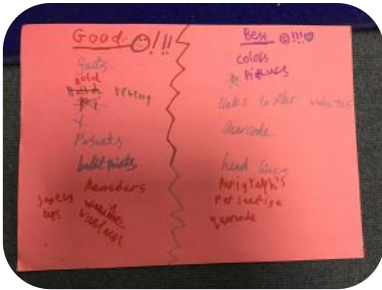
## Class 1

Class 1 have had a super busy week, we have been creating throne prototypes for King Charles III, the children have been following their designs and putting their new skills into practice to create these impressive structures. As a class we have also begun looking at our new book in English, it is a non-fiction book all about the kings and queens of England, we have been finding out some very interesting facts already! Isn't history fascinating! Year 1 have been working hard using number lines to subtract and the foundation have been busy matching and talking about odd and even pairs.



## Class 2

In Class 2 this week we have been measuring, measuring and measuring in maths! Year 2 have been introduced to metres and had fun rolling wheels and measuring the distance they rolled in metres; Year 3 have progressed to converting measures from mm to cm and cm to m. In English we have planned our Online Safety leaflets, and so next week we will be writing them up ready for displaying on the wall! In our computing lessons we have been using PowerPoint presentations to present information. They have picked up these skills very quickly and their progress is impressive! They are now very knowledgeable about how to stay safe online, so we can be sure they can answer positively the question 'Are we good digital citizens?'.



## Class 3

This week in English, we have been working on non-chronological reports about animals. The children began exploring key features of this text type, including the use of expanded noun phrases and the passive voice to create a formal, informative tone. In Maths, Year 4 pupils have been developing their understanding of money, while Years 5 and 6 have been tackling percentage problems with increasing confidence.

Our Science lessons took a fascinating turn as we explored evolutionary relationships between some unlikely animal pairs — including elephants and manatees — prompting plenty of curiosity and discussion. We also took part in the Book Quiz, and fingers are crossed for an invitation to the final after scoring an impressive 29 out of 31.

We finished the week with Number Day on Friday, enjoying lots of maths-focused activities and fun investigations across the school. It has been a lively and productive week of learning.

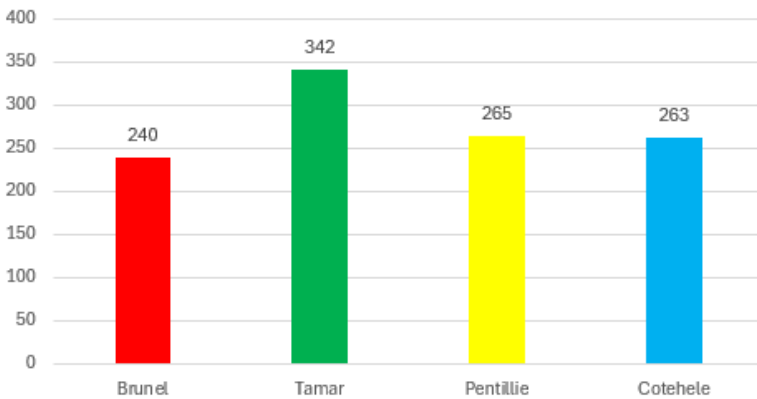

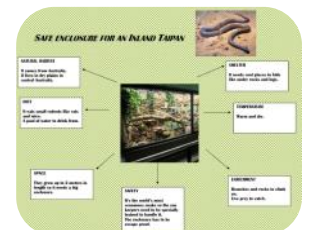
