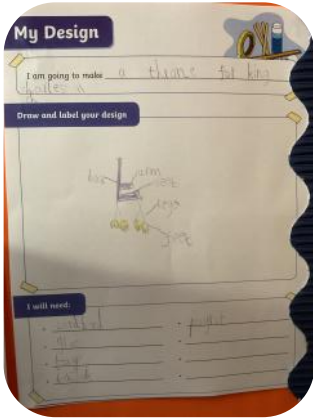

## Class 1

This week, Class 1 have been making structures in DT. We have had a great practical lesson learning about joints such as flange joints, L braces and slot joints. We then moved on to designing a throne for King Charles III using what we learned last week, and have seen some fantastic pieces of work! In Geography, we were learning all England and finding key places on a map. In Maths, the Pixies were learning one more and one less than 6, 7 and 8, whilst the Pirans were learning their number bonds to 20. The Pirans have also done a sustained write this week, using the class story for inspiration. What a busy week we have had!



## Class 2

What a busy week - again! This week we have started looking at information leaflets all about online safety so that we can build up information for our own persuasive leaflet. The children have really enjoyed reading stories and finding information online using the UK safer internet website. In maths we have completed our learning about statistics with lots of charts and tables and next week we will be measuring and calculating lengths. For National Storytelling week we will be engaging in some fun story activities with a story writing challenge! Our p.e this term has been travelling and jumping so we have travelled and jumped using various pieces of equipment on Friday afternoons, showing our physical creativity!



## Class 3

This week, the children have spent time planning and writing detailed, extended independent pieces set in a zoo. The resulting narratives have been imaginative, engaging, and full of thoughtful description — a real pleasure to read. In Maths, Year 4 pupils have been securing their times tables, while Years 5 and 6 have been calculating percentages of amounts and exploring increases and decreases with growing confidence.

In Geography, the class worked in teams to research and present on Niagara Falls, Angel Falls, Monument Valley, and the Grand Canyon. After sharing their findings, the children debated the different superlatives of each location — such as size, age, and cultural impact — before voting on an overall winner: The Grand Canyon.

In Computing, we began researching favourite animals using reliable online sources and created digital mind maps to organise key facts and ideas.

It has been a busy, productive, and thoroughly enjoyable week of learning across the curriculum.

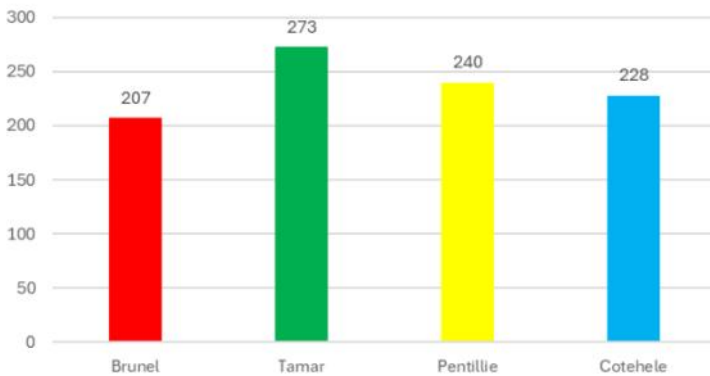

On Friday 16th January, our cross-country team headed to the muddy, gravelly grounds of Cotehele for the second race of the season. After inching our way through the narrow lanes and causing no small amount of disruption to local traffic, we eventually scaled the steep hills and abandoned the cars by the roadside. With the unmistakable aroma of burning clutches lingering in the air, the afternoon's racing began.

The Year 3/4 boys – Huxley, Maxwell, Maxley and James – were first up, with several pupils making their cross-country debuts. Despite the typically challenging conditions (wet, muddy and riddled with potholes), all four tackled the course with impressive determination. They completed the race with confidence and composure, and Maxwell finished with an excellent top-25 placing.

Our second and final race saw the Year 5/6 boys – Isaac F, Isaac H, Jake and Sima – take on two full laps of the same course. It was great to cheer them through the first lap before watching them dig deep for the final stretch. By the end they were soaked, splattered with mud, and thoroughly exhausted, but their smiles said it all.

A brilliant afternoon of running all round, and we're already looking forward to the next meet.
