Once completed it will then move to the school site. Days and opening times will remain the same during the transition period but once on the school site we will be looking at putting extended opening hours in place. Staff will remain the same.

As there are processes we need to follow, we are not able to currently give a time frame but I will keep you updated every step of the way. Exciting times!

Celebrating our learning...

Class 1

What a gorgeous week of sunshine we've had! Class 1 have enjoyed painting cityscapes using different techniques; we got very messy, but had lots of fun and our paintings came out rather well, I think you'll agree! In Maths, Year 1 have been learning all about mass and volume, we have been busy weighing items using scales. Foundation have been learning about doubles up to 10 and have started to explore odds and evens. Science has been interesting: following on from our experiment, we have learnt that plants need light, water and warmth to grow well. The seed that has been in the fridge didn't grow at all, but our seed that had all the right conditions is doing well and hopefully will become a sunflower. Foundation have been on a nature walk to look for signs of Spring during their science lesson, they drew some beautiful pictures to show what they had seen on their walk.



Class 2

It seems as though every week gets busier in Class 2! This week we have been learning about lines of symmetry in maths and in English have written our letters innovated from The boy who grew dragons. Fantasy pets that the children have written about include unicorns, T Rexes, firebreathing dragons and gymnastics performing monsters! Obviously, the main excitement for Year 3 was the Farm & Country trip on Wednesday which was absolutely wonderful. The children loved getting involved with so many different activities and finding out so much about the natural world in a practical way. We took part in so many activities such as making eggy bread, grinding flour, juice making, planting veggies as well as petting newborn lambs and calves. The children were immaculately behaved and did the whole school community proud.



Class 3

It has been another busy week in Class 3: in English, we have been writing stories about a Roman soldier, focusing on building character, description and atmosphere. Meanwhile, Maths lessons have involved translating shapes and working with co-ordinates, helping pupils develop accuracy and confidence with position. In Science, the Year 5 and 6 children have been learning about natural selection and how species can change over time. Our History work has explored the Roman army and how it supported the growth of the empire. During Computing, pupils have continued coding their own Scratch games, improving both design and functionality. We have been practising how to catch effectively in dodgeball, with an emphasis on control and teamwork. And in Art, the children have been drawing Roman villas in 3D, using perspective techniques to create depth in their work.

As a school we purchase licences for TTRS and Spelling Shed to support the children with vital aspects of their learning. Each week when we look at engagement levels, there are the consistent few who have excellent stats, but there are far too many who do not engage at all.

Practising and learning spelling patterns are crucial for building the foundations for reading fluency, vocabulary development and comprehension. It also reduces the cognitive load for writing composition.

It is a similar message for practising and learning times tables. Building those secure foundations enable the children to access more challenging aspects of maths, boosts mental arithmetic and confidence in problem-solving.

Please can you support your child to access this aspect of their home learning each week.

If you do not have your log in for Spelling Shed or TT Rockstars (Y1-Y6) please let the office know and they will send it to you.

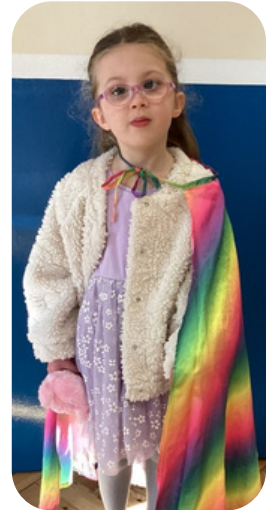

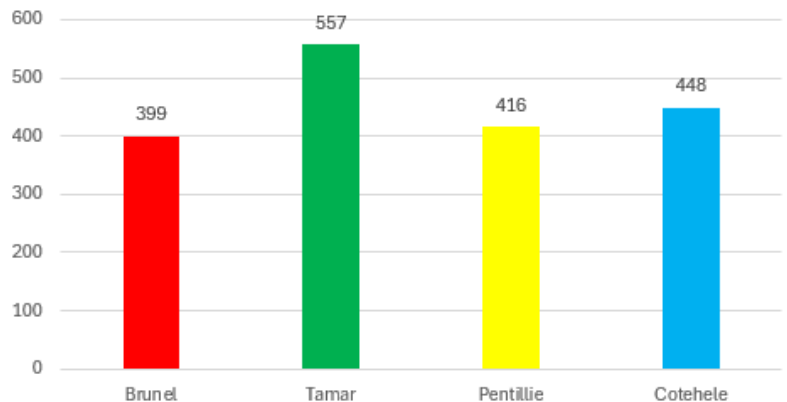

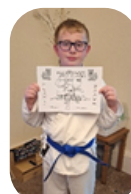

Is your child in Year 5? Would they like to join in with Cadets on a Friday night?

Cargreen Yacht Club has a thriving cadet section providing recreational sailing and structured sail training for children aged from 10 to 18 years.

Staffed entirely by enthusiastic volunteers, sail training is provided through a Royal Yachting Association Recognised Training Centre, run by RYA qualified instructors. All sessions have safety boat cover with qualified crews.

Cadets do not need to purchase or own their own dinghy (although many of them do) as the club has its own fleet of dinghies which the cadets can use (ten Laser Picos, three RS Fevas, two RS Visions and one Topper).

Cadets must have their own, well fitting, buoyancy aid as these are not provided by the club.

Cadets meet on Friday evening at 1730 between April and late September.
