Celebrating our learning...

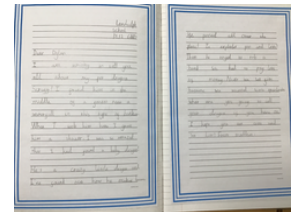
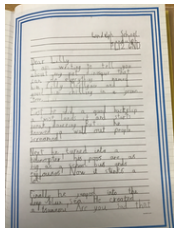
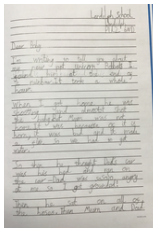
Class 1

This week Class 1 have been creating artwork inspired by pop artist Roy Lichtenstein, we have enjoyed using bright colours and stencils to create our paintings! There has been lots of discussion around 3D shape for Foundation, whether they stack or roll when building with them and if they can see 2D shapes in the 3D shapes. Year 1 have been continuing to explore mass and volume and this week we have been getting wet to understand volume using the water tray. In P.E. we have been producing dances that link to celebrations, this week we celebrated Christmas, to the children's surprise! PSHE we have been thinking about how we are thankful for everything we have and how lucky we are.



Class 2

This week in Class 2 we have completed our letters and published them in our best handwriting. They look so wonderful! The children really took on board the importance of presentation in their publishing and I am so proud of their efforts. In our maths learning we have finished our shape unit and have made a start on fractions...wish us luck! In our history learning we have been learning about the ancient Romans, how the empire developed and grew, as well as why. We learned that the Romans wanted wealth and power! We have also looked at the Roman army to see why they were so successful and what strategies they used to defeat their enemies. On top of this, we have begun looking at some Roman architecture; we have compared Roman villas to amphitheatres – the main difference being their shape! We are all looking forward to some Easter crafts next week and completing this lovely unit that we've enjoyed so much!



Class 3

This week has been particularly busy! Years 4 and 5 visited Songfest where they performed the songs they have been practising, showing great enthusiasm and confidence. And on Thursday, the Year 5 pupils attended Junior Lifeskills, taking part in a range of workshops led by members of the emergency services who taught them important safety skills. In English, we have been editing our Roman soldier stories while also exploring different reading strategies to support understanding. Within Maths lessons, pupils have been tackling shape-based problem solving, applying their knowledge in a range of contexts. Science learning has focused on how we know species have changed over time, with a particular look at fossils and the evidence they provide. Meanwhile, our History lessons have involved running a role-playing simulation of the fall of the Roman Empire, helping children to understand the different factors that contributed to its decline.

As a school we purchase licences for TTRS and Spelling Shed to support the children with vital aspects of their learning. Each week when we look at engagement levels, there are the consistent few who have excellent stats, but there are far too many who do not engage at all.

Practising and learning spelling patterns are crucial for building the foundations for reading fluency, vocabulary development and comprehension. It also reduces the cognitive load for writing composition.

It is a similar message for practising and learning times tables. Building those secure foundations enable the children to access more challenging aspects of maths, boosts mental arithmetic and confidence in problem-solving.

Please can you support your child to access this aspect of their home learning each week.

If you do not have your log in for Spelling Shed or TT Rockstars (Y1-Y6) please let the office know and they will send it to you.

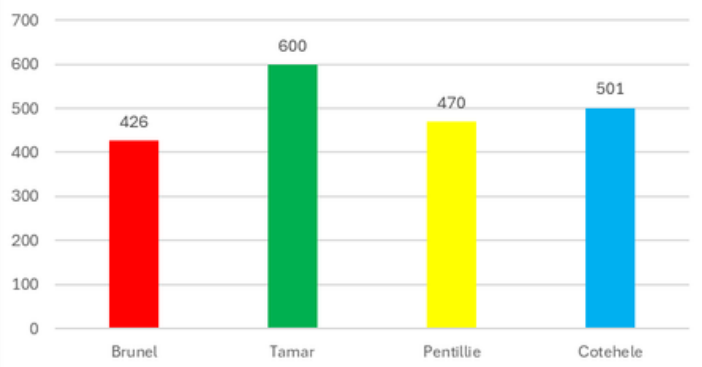
