Celebrating our learning...

Class 1

Wow, week one done already! Class 1 have been busy exploring our new book, 'Grandad's Island'. We have enjoyed discussing the characters and the settings in our new story. In Maths, Foundation have been building numbers bigger than 10 and Year 1 have been learning to count in 2s, 5s and 10s. Mrs Ashley has been covering children in glitter to try and help them understand about germs in Science and Mrs Ball is taking the class around the world in Geography, learning about the continents.



Class 2

Class 2 have had a lovely first week back in what is set to be a very short half term! Our new enquiry question is 'Where does our food come from?' with the subtitle of... 'and where does it go?!', so on Monday and Tuesday we made a start with our English linked with Geography learning about European countries and what it is like in those countries. We spent some time looking at atlases and landmark maps and used our oracy skills to work collaboratively in groups discussing what we would see or do in some of those European countries. The children then worked together to make a journey plan through Europe, deciding where they would go and what they would like to see or do. In maths we are working our way through our fractions unit, we have one more week to go before we will be moving on to time. We have a good link with science and DT this term, with Year 2 learning about nutrition, Year 3 learning about the digestive system, and all of us making healthy food with Mrs Plumb in DT! We hope you enjoyed the muesli the children brought home!



Class 3

Returning to school after the Easter break, the children have enjoyed sharing stories from their holidays, with adventures ranging from trips to Florida and South Africa to relaxing staycations closer to home. Inspired by our new class text *The Arrival* by Shaun Tan, pupils have been writing imaginative narratives and thoughtful letters, producing some excellent work. In Maths, the Year 4 children have been making great progress with their times tables through regular practice, while Years 5 and 6 have been exploring function machines and statistics as an introduction to algebra. Across our Geography lessons, we have researched and compared different methods of farming in the UK and the Ivory Coast. During Science, the class has been learning about the function of the heart and how it supports the body. As part of DT, pupils have explored a range of ingredients and researched where they come from, developing their understanding of food origins.

As a school we purchase licences for TTRS and Spelling Shed to support the children with vital aspects of their learning. Each week when we look at engagement levels, there are the consistent few who have excellent stats, but there are far too many who do not engage at all.

Practising and learning spelling patterns are crucial for building the foundations for reading fluency, vocabulary development and comprehension. It also reduces the cognitive load for writing composition.

It is a similar message for practising and learning times tables. Building those secure foundations enable the children to access more challenging aspects of maths, boosts mental arithmetic and confidence in problem-solving.

Please can you support your child to access this aspect of their home learning each week.

If you do not have your log in for Spelling Shed or TT Rockstars (Y1-Y6) please let the office know and they will send it to you.

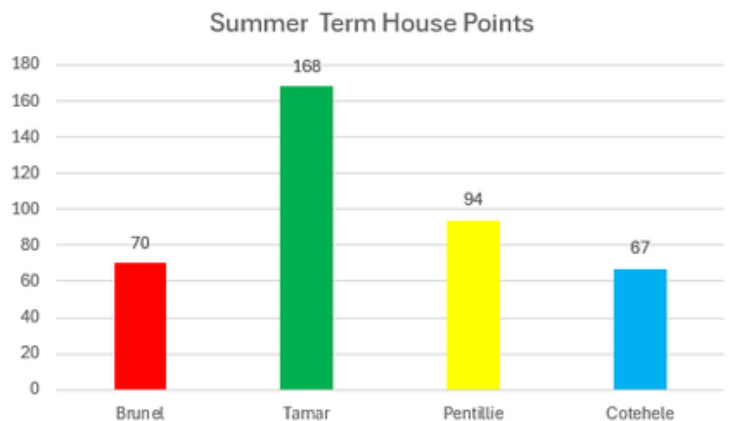
