Celebrating our learning...

Class 1

What a great start to the new term, the children have shown fantastic enthusiasm for their learning and have worked incredibly hard. They have been busy with their non-fiction writing about flowers and plants, building on the knowledge they developed last term.

In Science, the class has been very excited to begin to explore the world of minibeasts, discovering lots of fascinating facts. It has also been wonderful to get back to our Wild Tribe sessions, where the children have loved learning outdoors, developing new skills and linking to our Science by going on a minibeast hunt. They found worms, millipedes and various other minibeasts hiding in all sorts of nooks and crannies.

In Maths, the Y1's have been focusing on direction and position, and the Foundation children have been exploring sharing and grouping. The children have found it both fun and engaging.

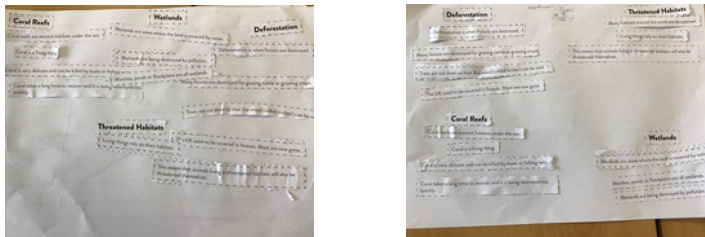


Class 2 ...and Year 4

This week has been a fun, and quite different one for us in Class 2 as we have had our Year 4 friends joining us since Wednesday! We have mostly spent our time finishing off bits and bobs that didn't get finished at the end of the short term from before the half term break! In English we have thought carefully about the structure and features needed for information texts and we are building up information about Greece; in maths we are learning about mass and capacity. Over the next couple of weeks we will be weighing masses, comparing them and learning about volume and capacity – lots of hands on opportunities!

On Thursday we welcomed a visitor, Tom, who came to talk to us about democracy and parliament. He explained about what MPs do and how important decisions are made in our country, which is a great addition to our commitment to British Values.

Next week we are looking forward to getting our teeth into our new topic and enquiry question.

Tomas Williams, the Senior Education and Engagement Officer for SW England, came into school to give the children a very engaging talk on how the UK Parliament works. As a school we purchase licences for TTRS and Spelling Shed to support the children with vital aspects of their learning. Each week when we look at engagement levels, there are the consistent few who have excellent stats, but there are far too many who do not engage at all.

Practising and learning spelling patterns are crucial for building the foundations for reading fluency, vocabulary development and comprehension. It also reduces the cognitive load for writing composition.

It is a similar message for practising and learning times tables. Building those secure foundations enable the children to access more challenging aspects of maths, boosts mental arithmetic and confidence in problem-solving.

Please can you support your child to access this aspect of their home learning each week.

If you do not have your log in for Spelling Shed or TT Rockstars (Y1-Y6) please let the office know and they will send it to you.

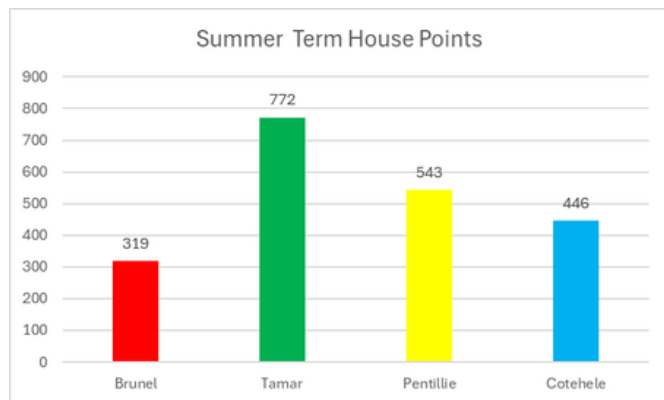

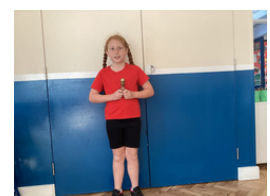
