Celebrating our learning...

Class 1

What a fabulous start to the week, a trip to Portwrinkle beach. 😊 They all had a fantastic time combining fun with learning in the wonderful outdoors! Time was spent exploring rockpools, building sandcastles, a cheeky paddle in the sea and of course no trip to the beach would be complete without an ice-cream! They ran out of time to enjoy some parachute games, so Mrs Truscott made sure they were able to do them in Wild Tribe instead.

In other news... they have continued their exploration of minibeasts by investigating plants as microhabitats, discovering how tiny creatures live and thrive in different environments. In History they are finding out about lighthouses – similarities and differences between now and in Victorian times. They have done some great writing about their visit to the beach and have been busy exploring number and pattern in Maths. They even managed to find time to welcome our 'new starters' into school.

It has been a week full of discovery, curiosity, and excitement for learning.



Class 2

In Class 2 this week we have been poetry writers! We have looked at examples of haiku poems and have identified the features of them...3 lines, 5 syllables for the first line, 7 syllables for the second line and 5 syllables again for the final line! We tried to go on a lovely nature walk around the school for inspiration, but sadly the weather forced us to make it an imaginary attempt. So, we have gathered our ideas and are now ready for writing! In Maths, we are coming to the end of our measures unit of mass and capacity...again, we are hoping that the weather will allow us to get outside so we can do some practical water investigations related to volume and capacity! Our History learning has really begun now and we have already gained some new knowledge about the Victorians – ready for our trip in a couple of weeks' time! We were quite shocked to learn about children as young as 4 being made to sweep chimneys! Looking into next week, we are looking forward to getting stuck in to the next part of our learning, specifically what life was like in general for Victorian children.



Class 3

Inspired by our class novel Street Child, Class 3 have been reading, discussing and writing about Victorian life, developing both their comprehension and creative writing skills. In Maths, the children have tackled a variety of investigations, including logic puzzles and mathematical art projects, which have encouraged them to think systematically and creatively. In History, we have compared the lives of rich and poor Victorian children, exploring the stark differences in their daily experiences and learning about some of the dangerous jobs that many poorer children were forced to undertake. We have focused on how drugs and alcohol can affect the body in science, helping pupils understand the impact of different substances on health.

As a school we purchase licences for TTRS and Spelling Shed to support the children with vital aspects of their learning. Each week when we look at engagement levels, there are the consistent few who have excellent stats, but there are far too many who do not engage at all.

Practising and learning spelling patterns are crucial for building the foundations for reading fluency, vocabulary development and comprehension. It also reduces the cognitive load for writing composition.

It is a similar message for practising and learning times tables. Building those secure foundations enable the children to access more challenging aspects of maths, boosts mental arithmetic and confidence in problem-solving.

Please can you support your child to access this aspect of their home learning each week.

If you do not have your log in for Spelling Shed or TT Rockstars (Y1-Y6) please let the office know and they will send it to you.

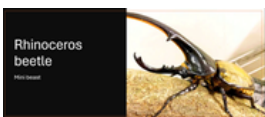
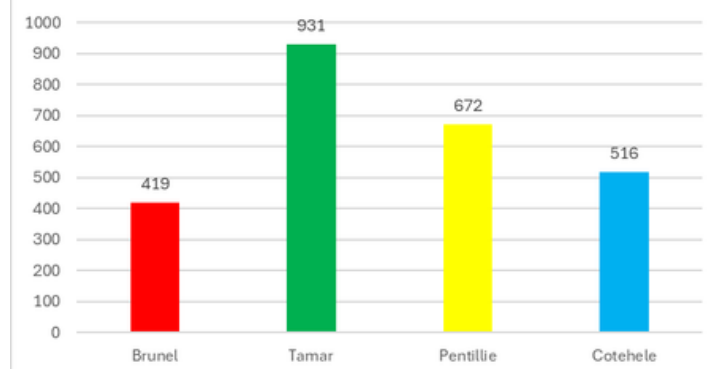
