



Reowta Years 2 and 3 - Home Learning Challenges

At Landulph School we believe home learning to be an essential and enjoyable part of a child's education. Home learning encompasses a plethora of activities facilitated by those at home which support and enhance children's learning.

From the learning grid below, you need to choose a **minimum of two activities** to do over the half term, but please feel free to do as many as you want.

The children will be given opportunities to share what they have been doing and celebrate their successes with their class. The emphasis will be on the children sharing their work rather than teacher marking. You might want to send in a photograph, they might record it in writing, make something or they might just talk about what they have done.

Our topics this term are: the local area, maps, rocks, representing numbers using tens and ones and retelling stories.

Self-Managers	Be organised Make a fact file of information about different rock types. Be sure to include information about different types of rock.	Manage Emotions Our story is about a boy whose emotions change like the river. Can you make an emotions chart for yourself over the course of a day or week?
Effective Participators	Get involved Make a mini museum of rocks or fossils. Label and caption the items in your museum (you could use a shoe box or something similar).	Find Solutions Find out some information about the River Tamar. Can you make a quiz about it to share with the class?
Creative Thinkers	Take Creative risks Decorate a rock or pebble and bring it in to show us. Could we build a Reowta Rock display?	Imagine Create a story map for an imaginary story for your local area. You can just plan and draw it with icons, it doesn't have to be written out completely.
Reflective Learners	Set yourself challenges Write an information text about something we have learned about...rocks, fossils, maps, harvest, Hindus.	Share learning Our English story is The River by Tom Percival. Can you visit a river and send us a photo?
Enquirers	Evaluate evidence Find out how your local area has changed over time. Ask grown ups that you know if they remember if things ever looked different and report back to us.	Explore a Question...what is a fossil? A fossil is an imprint; can you make prints of objects to look like a fossil? You could print shells, leaves or even toy animals using paint or ink.
Team Worker	Build Team Strengths Make a 3D map of your house using any medium you like. It could be drawn, or made with lego, junk modelling or building blocks.	Take responsibility Have a family treasure hunt at home. Take turns at suggesting an object for someone to find!

In order to embed core English and Maths skills, we ask that children read at home daily, learn phonics/spellings and access our bought subscriptions: TTRS and Spelling Shed. Logins are on reading folders!
